

Making a Magic Wand

What you will need:

- Quite long, thick, straight twigs or sticks (twigs, chop sticks, old pencils or dowelling rods)
- Newspaper torn up into small pieces
- White or neutral- coloured tissue paper
- PVA glue plus water or a nice sticky flour and water mix
- String and Paints

Instructions:

- 1. Find a suitable twig or stick in your garden or at the park. It doesn't need to be completely straight in fact, slightly twisted wands look the best.
- 2. Blend water with PVA glue (use a ratio of about 4 glue to 1 water) and dip your newspaper pieces into the mix.
- 3. Wrap the gluey paper sections around your stick until the whole thing is covered. Do another layer after the first one so that the stick is thickly coated.
- 4. If you want your wand to have a 'bulb' at one end, keep adding paper to this part until it bulges out like a ball.
- 5. When you have the shape you really like, cover the whole stick with pieces of gluey white tissue paper.
- 6. Dip a piece of string in the glue and then wrap the gluey string around your wand. You may need to add extra glue to hold it in place.
- 7. Allow the stick to dry completely.
- 8. Paint your wand any colour you like and let the paint dry.
- 9. You are done.
