Alphabet challenge

Puzzles are great for developing mathematical logic skills, as well as training us to be resilient if a solution proves tricky to find...!

AIMS: Use number skills to solve some addition problems

You will need: paper and pencil

This is a special alphabet grid. It gives each vowel a value of 10p and values of 2p, 3p, 5p, 7p and 8p for consonants.

Getting started:

Write your **first and last names.** Note the **cost** of each letter.

Find the **total cost** of your name.

Repeat this for other members of your family.

Whose name is worth the most? Whose name is worth the least?

Some strategies for adding several small numbers

- The vowels are all worth 10p which can be added using place value.
- Look for pairs that total 10p, e.g. P and T or C and M.
- Use doubles!
- Start with the larger number and count on in 1s, or by 'bridging' a multiple of 10p.
- Write the names clearly. Cross off each letter as it is counted.
- Check your answers by adding in a different order.
