How to help Jackass write a Technology Quiz

What to do:

- 1. Read the first question on *Jackass's Technology Quiz*: What can you do with a mobile phone?
- 2. Write one <u>correct</u> answer next to (a), (b) or (c), e.g. *make a phone call;* send a text; take a photo.
- 3. Write silly, wrong answers next to the other two letters, e.g. *make toast; iron your clothes; hoover your room*.
- 4. Do the same thing for the next four questions.
- 5. Now create two <u>brand new</u> questions of your own for Questions 6 and 7. Think of items of technology like Gameboys, X-Boxes or Wi consoles or apps like Zoom or Skype to use in the questions
- 6. Come up with (a), (b) and (c) answers as you did before.
- 7. For Questions 8 and 9, Jackass has used words to describe his tablet (*small*) and the memory of his computer (*huge*). People taking the quiz are going to have to come up with other words that mean the same. So that you can mark their quiz answers, you need to know the words people could use.
- 8. Use the *Word Banks* page to record all the words that you can think of that mean the same as *small* and *huge*.
- 9. Decide how many points a person should get for their correct answers.
